Works for the october 2010 new school year have begun

A new building of 2 classes will allow to receive CM1 and CM2 classes.

A computer building will also be built in order to give data processing lessons to the

pupils. This building and the 22 new PC that will equip it, have been offered by the IB Remarketing company which is the French leader in the reprocessing of computer equipment.

Sponsor a class or a pupil

Sponsorships are essential to balance the operating expenses of the school even though around 60 % of the families pay approximately 100 € per year for the scholarship of their child.

This is the average cost requested in Niger for the private schools and this represents approximately a one-month wage of a civil servant. However the wages of the school team added to the expenses and consumables amount to a cost of 180 € per year and per pupil. Up to now, the sums received from the sponsorships enable balancing the 2009-2010 school year. However the school needs more sponsorships and more support for the coming years.



Isouffou, CI teacher

Isouffou, the new teacher for the C1 is 33 years old ; he is married and has 3 children. Isouffou has been trained in the normal school of Tahoua. He has been teaching in Abalak for C1 and CP classes since 2005.

Assa the new teacher for CP class is married and has an eight-month old daughter. He has been trained in Tahoua and has taught in CE1 and CE2 classes at Itrizmane.

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The school is getting itself organized

Since December, **English lessons** have begun, at the rate of one hour per week for CE1 and CE2 classes.

The **Association of Parents of Pupils** (APP) administers and takes care of all school problems. It consists of fifteen persons elected by parents' pupils. President Youssouf wishes APP to be very active and to be used as an example for the other schools. APP meets once a month with the aim, among others, to bring classes outside, to make pupils discovering what they never saw before, as fishing and intensive gardening along Tabalak lake located 80 km from Abalak.

In January, after the evaluation of the first quarter, every pupil has received his first school report.

Each sponsor of a pupil will receive regularly a copy of the school report of his godchild to be able to follow his schooling.

In the CE2 class, 13 pupils did not get fifty per cent, mainly because of a deficiency in reading. Rissa, their teacher, must give support to them with remedial classes for reading every Saturday morning.

The structures of Tanat school are setting up. Each class has a **class council**, consisting of three persons democratically elected, to administer its smooth running.

The Association of Educating Mothers (AEM) bound to encourage the schooling of young girls and avoid early marriages will be set up very soon.

Salads and flowers in the school yard

Within the scope of PPA (Physical and Practical Activities), a kitchen garden has been created by Rissa in the school yard. Salads, tomatoes, and gourds may be found. Many flowers have been planted along the administrative building and along the walls. Kaloula, who is the school keeper, helped by the pupils, ensures the daily watering and above all the protection of all these greenery against goats, birds and lizards.

The plan of Tanat School

Taking into account the condition of the educative system in the Abalak department of Niger, inhabitants gathered within the ONODEP association chaired by Billou Mohamed Moctar, deputy mayor, to open and manage a school.

The French TANAT association is dedicated to support this project.

2009 - stage 1 : opening in October of the primary school with 4 classes. CI, CP, CE1 CE2, and further CM1 in 2010 and CM2 in 2011.

2012 - stage 2: Secondary school opening.

2013 - stage 3: High school opening.

The necessary investments for the primary level represent approximately 100 000 € and thereafter 200 000 € for the secondary school and the high school.

A pedagogic and technical joint venture has been set up with Bayard School in Grenoble. Sponsorships take care of the most underprivileged pupils and balance the operating expenses.
